*Amy D. Goldstein joins Houston Housing Resource as director*

**HOUSTON** – Amy D. Goldstein has joined Houston Housing Resource, Inc. as the nonprofit organization’s new director. Houston Housing Resource helps local families and seniors served by the Houston Housing Authority through programs that move families toward self-sufficiency and keep seniors safe.

Goldstein, a former two-year member of the Houston Housing Resource Board of Directors, will focus her efforts on enhancing and expanding self-sufficiency programs for Houston Housing Authority (HHA) residents, meeting the needs of seniors in the community, and working with local job training, health care, educational and cultural organizations to create beneficial programs for housing residents.

Houston Housing Resource is the nonprofit support affiliate of the Houston Housing Authority. “Houston Housing Resource is an organization with a huge amount of potential for enhancing the lives of Housing Authority residents, in part by forging coalitions with other nonprofits that provide social services,” said Goldstein.

Most recently, Goldstein headed a public relations consulting firm, following two decades of policy and advocacy work for nonprofit organizations.

“We want the Houston Housing Authority to be a stepping stone for families on their way toward self-sufficiency, as well as a vital resource for our most vulnerable citizens,” said Tim Seckinger, HHA’s interim President and Chief Executive Officer. “The addition of Amy as the director of

Houston Housing Resource will strengthen HHA immensely as we transform communities and improve lives.”

Goldstein holds a Master’s degree from the Jewish Theological Seminary of America and a Bachelor of Arts in Middle Eastern History and Politics from the University of Michigan.
