MAYOR APPOINTS REAL ESTATE DEVELOPMENT VETERAN TO HOUSTON HOUSING AUTHORITY BOARD

HOUSTON—Commercial real estate veteran and community leader Lance Gilliam will serve as Commissioner on the Houston Housing Authority Board of Commissioners.

Mayor Annise Parker appointed Gilliam to complete the remainder of a two-year term ending January 31, 2012.

“I’ve known Lance for many years. With his strong business credentials and passion for the city of Houston, I believe he will be an asset to the Houston Housing Authority Board,” said Mayor Parker.

The Housing Authority is governed by a Board of Commissioners that sets policy and provides leadership to enable the agency to serve thousands of families, elderly and other individuals in need.

The new Housing Authority Commissioner also is a member of the Urban Land Institute and serves on the Children’s Museum of Houston’s board of directors and executive committee.
